Last July my wife and I had the privilege to vacation for a week in Hawaii. Maui is the most beautiful place I have ever been. The rolling waves, majestic mountains, and lush foliage are truly a sight to see. But we never thought we see the number of homeless people we witnessed in that tropical paradise.

According to the National Alliance to End Homelessness, Hawaii has the third highest percentage of homeless families in the country behind Washington D.C. and New York. For every 10,000 families in Hawaii, 21.1 are homeless. Here in Utah, that number is 4 families per 10,000. Whether you are at the beach or hiking the Wasatch front, family homelessness is on the rise.

As one of over 200 affiliates in 43 states, Family Promise Salt Lake is a leader in addressing family homelessness with our unique and one-of-a-kind approach. Many people think that Family Promise simply shelters children and their parents/guardians, but there is so much more to what we do!

While in our program, families work with case management to explore the barriers that lead to homelessness, find gainful employment, appropriate schooling/childcare, and eventually sustainable housing. In the near future, we plan to expand our services and invite our guests to take a financial literacy course, a healthy cooking course, and to provide community resources that address both physical and mental health.

I am proud to be a part of the Family Promise network of affiliates that understand the complexities of homelessness and that seek a holistic community-based approach! With your support, we will continue to help make a significant impact on the lives of children and their families for years to come.

with the families! "


